1. A minimum number of **8 students** must be enrolled before the class will be held. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis.
2. Classes may be taken non-accredited (not on a transcript) or accredited (on a transcript towards a diploma) and will be charged as such. Accredited elective classes are .5 credits per semester and \$65 per student/per month, due with regular tuition. Non-accredited elective classes are \$45 per student/per month, due with regular tuition.
3. An elective course may be dropped within **10 CALENDAR DAYS** of the start date. The balance of the month's tuition will be forfeited but no other drop fees will be assessed. If a class is dropped AFTER the 10 day grace period, tuition for the rest of the semester will be assessed due to commitments to instructors.
4. Students may change from accredited status to non-accredited status within the first 30 days of the class. However, accredited tuition will still be owed for the rest of the semester, due to Northwest reporting procedures and obligations to instructors.
5. If an accredited student drops the class after the 10 day grace period, they will receive an F in the class and on their transcript.
6. All 9th - 12th grade students participating in Athletics and all Carson Smith Scholarship students **MUST** be accredited.
7. Monday -Wednesday classes begin JAN. 9. Tuesday - Thursday classes begin JAN. 10. Friday classes begin JAN. 13.
8. Classes marked with an ** are required classes for accredited 9th through 12th grade students for a diploma.
9. There are often additional activity or textbook fees associated with elective classes.
